## TO SIGN UP FOR A CLASS:

All classes, camps, and workshops must be registered for in advance; unless otherwise noted, this should be done by 2:00 pm on the last weekday before the class (some classes may have an earlier deadline). To place your name on the class list, call 502-867-0060. **Your registration will be finalized once payment is received by the ArtWorks office.** Office hours are 10:00 am – 2:00 pm, Monday through Thursday.

Checks or money orders may be mailed to: ArtWorks, 800 Cincinnati Rd, Suite #5, Georgetown KY 40324-8960, or you may pay in person at the ArtWorks office by cash, check, or money order. ArtWorks is not able to accept credit cards at this time.

In the event that the class for which you've registered is canceled or does not meet its minimum enrollment, the instructor or someone from our office will call to let you know. For most classes that have a minimum enrollment, the instructor will offer a single student the option of taking it as a private class for half again the class fee. In other words, if only one student signs up for a \$40 class that has a 2-person minimum, the student would be able to take it as a private lesson for \$60. Prepaid students who do not choose this option will be issued a refund for the class.

Students will learn basic techniques of painting with acrylics to create various flowers and butterflies on a decorative wood piece. Materials fee covers all necessary supplies, including basic brushes, paints, and a decorative wood piece. 2–8 students.

#### 4, 15, 25: Painting Landscapes in Acrylic

Learn the basics of acrylic paint and produce a painting in this 4-week session. Students must provide their own supplies: a basic set of acrylic paints (cadmium red light, cadmium yellow medium, ultramarine blue, hooker's green, dioxin purple, burnt sienna, and titanium white), gesso, brushes (bristle and soft brushes in various sizes and a script brush), and canvas or canvas board (size 16"x20"). An easel is recommended but not required. ArtWorks offers some supplies for purchase. This class can be taken more than once for continuing instruction. 1–4 students.

#### 6: Painting from the Heart in Oils

This is an open-studio format oil painting class. Come for one to four hours, as little or as often as you like. Bring a 16 x 20 canvas and four brushes (big filbert, medium round, medium fan, & a detail brush). Paints, solvents, and other supplies are extra and may be purchased from the instructor.

## PHOTOGRAPHY

### 5: Digital Photography

Begins with a description of basic photography concepts such as aperture, shutter speed, focal length, and depth of field. We will cover the differences between traditional film photography and digital technology. Additional areas that will be discussed include transferring and manipulating digital images, color spaces, printing, and a look at digital retouching. Bring your digital camera, as well as some examples of photos that didn't turn out the way you had hoped. 2–10 students.

### 21: Digital Photography 2

This class is for photographers who are comfortable with the basics of digital photography. We will cover topics that apply primarily to digital SLR cameras. Very few point-and-shoot cameras will have the features needed to complete this class. Most of the Canon EOS series cameras have the features needed. Nikon cameras including but not limited to D40, D50, D60, D70, D80, D90, D5000, D200, D300, D3, and D3X would be great cameras to use for this class. Other cameras would be fine if they include among their list of features: adjustable white balance, RAW data format, advanced focusing options, advanced metering functions. Topics to be covered include white balance, advanced retouching, advanced metering, advanced focus functions, HDR (high dynamic range) and RAW data format. 2–10 students.

### 3: Photography as an Art Form

The objective of this class is to encourage students to begin to develop a personal photographic style. This class is for the photographer who is already familiar with the basics of photography and wants to explore the artistic aspects of the medium. Students may work in either digital or analog, but they are responsible for their own film and printmaking costs (expect to spend up to \$35).

By the end of the class, each student will have at least six 8x10 prints centered around a theme of their choosing. Theme examples include street scenes, nature, macro, architecture, war, documentary, and still life.

This class is not for the casual snap shooter. We will view and discuss the works of other photographers in our classes. During classes we will view and critique each others' work. 2–10 students.
