### 2, 20: Beginning Drawing

Bring pencil and sketch pad (or paper) and learn to draw with this very talented teacher who specializes in drawing animals. This is a class for people who want to enjoy working and have fun. The Beginning Drawing motto is: "My name is not Xerox!" This class can be taken more than once for continuing instruction. 2–12 students.

### 17, 35: Painting Landscapes in Acrylic

Adults and seniors, beginner/intermediate

Class fee: \$65 Materials fee: \$10 (optional)

Learn the basics of acrylic paint and produce a painting in this 4-week session. Students must provide their own supplies: a basic set of acrylic paints (cadmium red light, cadmium yellow medium, ultramarine blue, hooker's green, dioxin purple, burnt sienna, and titanium white), gesso, brushes (bristle and soft brushes in various sizes and a script brush), and canvas or canvas board (size 16"x20"). Or, for a \$10 materials fee, we will provide these supplies for your use during class for one month. ArtWorks offers some supplies for purchase. This class can be taken more than once for continuing instruction. 1–4 students.

### 5: Painting Out Loud

Taught by Karen LaBach

Every Saturday, December 5 – Feb. 27, 1:00–5:00 pm

(no class on December 26)

No need to pre-register

Adults, all levels

Class fee: \$30 per session

Learn to take what you see and make it your own invention! Bring in your own resource material or use some of Karen's.

The Process: Study the material and make a sketch. Eliminate the detail and make a great composition. As soon as you are happy with your composition, wash all the areas in on your canvas. If you do not know your color

scheme yet, wash the warm colors in first like red and gold. You can add the cool players later. This is the fun part—as it is too early to make a mistake. Get the canvas to a rich solid place in the early stages.

Take a break and let it dry. Stand back and make the decisions about direction. What are you trying to say?

This is where the work becomes your invention! Get your geometry down and introduce linear elements. Suggest things—and stay away from hard lines. Paint in bursts and get all the ideas there in 20–30 minutes. Learn to have fun and your work will show it!

Materials: One 16 x 20 canvas, oil or acrylic paints (cadmium red, cadmium yellow, ultramarine blue, and white; no black!), and brushes (a large filbert, a medium round, a fan brush, and a detail brush).

## PHOTOGRAPHY

### 4: Digital Photography 1

Begins with a description of basic photography concepts such as aperture, shutter speed, focal length, and depth of field. We will cover the differences between traditional film photography and digital technology. Additional areas that will be discussed include transferring and manipulating digital images, color spaces, printing, and a look at digital retouching. Bring your digital camera, as well as some examples of photos that didn't turn out the way you had hoped. 2–12 students.
