ages 5 to adult, 1-2pm, one-day workshop

Make stamps out of clay to use in future classes to decorate your clay pieces.

Make unique free-form stamps or use stamp blanks provided by instructor.

Items to create textures and patterns will be provided by the instructor, or

you can bring your own. We encourage families to take classes together:

FAMILY PAIRS (2 from the same family) for 1½ cost. Students are encouraged

to bring small objects (no larger than a quarter) that may have an interesting

texture. *3-6 students*

17 - Coil a Whimsical Planter - Anne Leader - \$55

ages 8-12, 4:00-5:30p

Thursday, August 12, Friday, August 13, and Thursday, August 26

From planters with animal heads to carved patterns, from dozens of dots

to stamped textures, 8 through 12 year olds will enjoy expressing their

creativity while learning the proper technique to make coiled forms. This

class meets three times: two days in a row, then a break so the pieces can be

bisqued, then a third to glaze. *3-5 students*

Painting & Drawing

- 1 - Painting Landscapes in Acrylic** - Janice Gray - \$65 (plus materials) per session adults, 11:30am-1:30pm Thursdays
 session A - June 3-24
 session B - August 5-26
 Learn the basics of acrylic paint and complete a painting in this 4-week session. Materials can be supplied by ArtWorks for use in class (\$13), but if you would like to supply your own, please call or email for a list. *1-4 students*
This class can be taken more than once for continuing instruction.
- 16 - Figurative Painting** - Karen M. LaBach - \$35 per session or all three for \$90 adults, one-day workshop, 7-9pm
 session A - Monday, August 9
 session B - Monday, August 16
 session C - Monday, August 23
 Students are trained to see, analyze, and translate the figurative image onto the canvas using a variety of unique methods. The result is a very convincing rendering of the subject that can be executed in a very loose, sketchy style or a more refined, realistic treatment. Using this approach, an artist will be able to paint any subject as the method applies to all. Previous training is not necessary in order to grasp these principles. Students will need to provide their own materials (call for list), or pay \$30 for materials provided by the instructor. *1-10 students*
- 8 - Oil Painting for Beginners** - L. Diane Young - \$65 adults, 4-6pm Tuesdays
 session A - June 8-29
 session B - July 6-27
 session C - August 3-24
 For beginning oil painters. The class will cover everything from starting an oil painting to completion. We will discuss and put into practice the points of good painting: composition, drawing with paint, mixing colors, values and the edges. We will work from still life and/or life. Each class will begin with a short demo by the teacher.
 Students must provide their own materials. (Expect to spend around \$80. Call or email for a list.) *3-10 students*
- 7 - Intermediate and Advanced Oil Painting** - L. Diane Young - \$65
Intermediate/advanced. Adults, Tuesdays
 session A - 2-4 pm June 8-29
 session B - 6-8 pm June 8-29
 session C - 6-8 pm July 6-27
 session D - 2-4 pm August 3-24
 session E - 6-8 pm August 3-24
 For those who are experienced with oil painting and want to have better results, with one-on-one instruction to solve problems in your own painting. Bring in a painting in progress or start a new painting and in class we will work through its problems. Students must provide their own materials.

Crafts, Scrapbooking & Mixed Media**12 - Scrapbooking Fun** - Ann House - \$12

teen to adult, one-day workshop, 6-10pm

session A - Saturday, June 19

session B - Saturday, July 17

Gather together to enjoy an evening with others as you work on your photos and stories. Bring your own scrapbooking supplies or purchase supplies on hand from the teacher (expect to spend \$20-\$100). Hands-on help will be provided to complete your projects. *2-10 students*

14 - Intro to Bookbinding - Melissa Oesch

teen to adult, 6-8 pm, 3 individual sessions

session A - July 7 - \$37

session B - July 14 - \$37

session C - July 21 - \$37

follow-up session D - July 28 - \$30

Learn how to make your own journal or sketchbook! Here are four sessions designed to teach you three different book binding techniques. One of the focuses throughout all of the sessions will be eco-friendly and sustainable approaches to bookbinding. The sessions will be further divided into learning particular binding techniques: Japanese Stab binding (session A), Long-stitch binding (session B), and Coptic binding (session C). The fourth session is a follow-up for those who have attended session C. *3-12 students*

4 - Rainy Day Crafts for Kids - Lori S. Murray - \$120

Ages 5-14, 2-3:30pm Saturdays, June 5-26

Register by May 24

Learn to explore your creativity with indoor activities, perfect for sick days, rainy days or any day. Students will make their own playdough, life-sized portrait, paper bag masks, sock puppets. We'll play games, have some yummy snacks and tell silly stories.

Most materials included. Students are encouraged to bring in scissors, buttons, socks and plastic baggies to bring home playdough. *3-6 students*

10 - Create Your Own Book - Melissa Oesch

grades K-3, 10-11 Wednesdays, 2 individual sessions

session A - June 16 - \$12

session B - June 23 - \$17

follow-up session C - June 30 - \$12

This is the perfect introductory course for kids to learn how to write their own book. The sessions are based on the Reading Rainbow's Writer's Contest. Each session will provide some teaching and examples as well as offer time for brainstorming and sharing. The sessions are each focused on a different component of writing a book: the story, the illustrations, and editing. It will be a playful, imaginative time for kids to pick up new skills or begin focusing their creativity. The June 30 session is a follow-up for students from sessions A and/or B. *3-15 students*

Craft, Scrapbooking & Mixed Media *(continued)***3 - Knitting and Felting Bags** - Lori S. Murray - \$110

Intermediate. Teen to adult, 12-2pm Saturdays, June 5-26

Register by May 24

Sick of knitting scarves? This class will teach you knitting skills such as how to knit in the round, how to make I-cord and how to felt your project into a beautiful and stylish bag. Learn this technique with a simple bag and then learn to modify the design or amplify your skills to making something more creative and flashy. These projects are addictive and quick to knit up on large needles. Perfect for gifts! This class is for students who already have basic knitting skills.

Most materials provided. Students are encouraged to bring in scissors, tapestry needle, stitch markers and tape measure. If you are interested in starting a second project, you'll need to purchase additional yarns, or the instructor can supply them for an additional fee. *3-6 students*

5 - Creative Collage/Mixed Media - Lori S. Murray - \$125

Ages 8-adult, 6-7:30pm Mondays, June 7-28

Register by May 24

Use various types of materials and mediums to create a one-of-a-kind work of art. Students will use materials such as pen, ink, paint, paper, photos, fabric and other embellishments to layer and create a deep and meaningful piece. Students will create one or two final pieces and will learn techniques and tips for creating lines, texture and stroke. No fine arts skills or previous art knowledge necessary. Let your components speak your creative vision.

Most materials included. Students are encouraged to bring in scissors, meaningful photos, found objects, embellishments etc. that would enhance their final project. This will be discussed the first class, as well. *3-6 students*

9 - Memory Boxes - Lori S. Murray - \$125

Ages 8 - adult, 6-7:30pm Thursdays, June 10 - July 1

Register by May 27

Use various types of materials and mediums to create a one-of-a-kind memory box. Students will use materials such as pen, ink, paint, paper, photos, fabric and other embellishments to layer and create a deep and meaningful piece. Students will create one or two final pieces and will learn techniques and tips to embellish their memory boxes. No fine arts skills or previous art knowledge necessary. Let your components speak your creative vision. This is a 3-dimensional project that would be a counter-part to the Creative Collage/ Mixed Media class.

Most materials included. Students are encouraged to bring in scissors, meaningful photos, found objects, embellishments etc. that would enhance their final projects. This will be discussed the first class, as well. *3-6 students*

Creative Writing

- 6 - Creative Writing** - Fred Wright - \$40
adults, 7-8pm Mondays, June 7 - July 26
Learn the correct techniques for structuring and writing memoirs, nonfiction and fiction. The class is designed for anyone interested in writing for personal enjoyment, as well as for those interested in publishing a book. Each class meeting will be a building block to guide the writer, step by step, through the process necessary for creating their own manuscript, while covering various problem areas to be avoided. *1-15 students*
This class can be taken more than once for continuing instruction.

Photography

- 2 - Digital Photography I** - Keith House - \$90
teens to adults, 6:30-8pm Thursdays, June 3 - July 8
Learn basic photography concepts such as aperture, shutter speed, focal length and depth of field. We will cover the differences between traditional film photography and digital technology. Additional areas that will be discussed include transferring and manipulating digital images, color spaces, printing and a look at digital retouching. Bring your digital camera, as well as some examples of photos that didn't turn out the way you had hoped. Students are responsible for any printmaking costs or CD media used to bring photos to class (around \$20-\$30). *3-15 students*
- 15 - Medium Format Photography** - Keith House - \$100
teen to adult, 6:30-8pm Thursdays, July 22 - August 26
Medium format photography is the direct opposite of digital point-and-shoot "whiz bang" photography. This class will explore the format and encourage the student to develop the "eye" and the skills to master medium format. It takes a different attitude . . . it happens at a different pace . . . it is slower and more thoughtful. Students should own a medium format camera (defined as any camera that uses 120 or 220 film—this would include Holga, Seagull, Yashica, Mamiya, Rollei, Hasselblad, Bronica, etc.). All printmaking is at the student's expense (expect to spend \$40-\$50). *2-10 students*
- 13 - Portrait Photography** - Jami Henson - \$139
teens and adults, 6-8pm Mondays, July 5 - August 2
Learn both classic and modern portrait photography in a simple but comprehensive workshop. The curriculum is perfect for beginners who want to master any goal or just learn to make pleasing portraits of family and friends. It is also a great value for more advanced photographers and professionals who wish to refine their skills. Class covers posing, working with children and adults, studio and outdoor shots, exposure, lighting, camera operation, and much more. Bring your digital or film camera with its instruction manual and blank media (cards, film, etc.). Art League members and donors get a 20% discount. *1-10 students*
