Truly a beginning, this class starts with a discussion about kinds of pencils, papers and other materials and how they affect the finished artwork. Learn about lines and form as you do exercises with the provided workbook. Still life set ups and reference photos will be available to draw from during class, with an emphasis on the artist's story-telling role and the thinking behind the work, not just mindless copying. For beginners to experienced, this class celebrates drawing for the joy of it - loosen up, turn off your inner criticizer and draw, draw, draw. Basic paper and drawing implements will be provided, but feel free to bring your own favorites.

Description: Adobe Lightroom 3 is becoming a standard in the world of photography for developing digital images and organization of files. This class will cover the software in detail...setup, organizing of files, image manipulation, etc.. . In order to take the class each student will need a personal laptop computer and Lightroom 3 software. A 30 day demo copy of the software can be downloaded from Adobe.com and since the class covers 4 consecutive Thursday evenings the entire class can be taken using the demo software. Computers may be Mac or PC. I would strongly suggest bringing your own mouse and mousepad.....a laptop trackpad is not very useful with any graphics software.

The Artist's Way: with Susan Caldwell

Cost: \$150 Age Group: Adults Min/Max: 5/10

Class # 1-25-11: (January 25 through May 16) Wednesdays 12:00 - 2:00

The Artist's Way - a spiritual guide to creativity is a 12 week workshop in uncovering our creative self. I have taught this class 13 times (or more) and I never fail to learn something about myself and how I view myself as an artist and person. The class requires the student to read the weekly chapter, journal 3 pages of stream-of-conscious thoughts every morning and to take oneself on a weekly artist date. Many of my students have left the class with a renewed commitment to their creative talents and how it can better serve them. Some have quit their jobs to support themselves with their art. Some have accepted new jobs in areas that they are more suited to. Some have signed up for piano lessons, a watercolor class, a pottery class or a cooking class. One student bought a camera and became the photographer he always wanted to be. The 12 week commitment may seem overwhelming but, in fact, becomes a focal point of the student's week. The class is limited to 10 so that conversation can support the topics of the chapters.

We will have a project every class time. All project materials furnished. I guarantee this class will open some doors for you and give you a greater sense of self.

Digital Photography 1: with Keith House

Learn basic photography concepts such as aperture, shutter speed, focal length and depth of field. We will cover the difference between traditional film photography and digital technology. Additional areas that will be discussed include transferring and manipulating digital images, color spaces, printing and a look at digital retouching. Bring your Digital camera as well as some examples of photos that didn't turn out the way you had hoped. *Students are responsible for any printmaking costs or CD media used to bring photos to class. (around \$20-\$30)*
