This 4 hour workshop will start at Arts & Cultural Center Artzone with introduction and instructions. Every participant will get a handout showing the map and possible subject matter along the way.

As we walk our Georgetown circuit we will have opportunities for street photography, architectural photography, close-ups, informal portraits, still life, etc.. Our goals will be to improve our photo awareness and learning how to "see with a camera". This is a "hands on" approach to learning photography skills and there will be instruction and conversation throughout the workshop (shutter speed usage, aperture, etc.).

The photographer's goal is to capture the information that allows us to create an image that we see in our "mind's eye"...not necessarily what we see with our eyes.

Participants should wear comfortable shoes and clothing that is appropriate for the weather. Bring your camera bag, small snacks if desired, and water. This is not a strenuous trek by any means....more of a leisurely stroll through Georgetown with your camera. Keep in mind that you will be carrying your equipment for several hours so plan accordingly. If the weather is anything short of a monsoon the workshop will take place....rain or shine (that's part of the fun!).

The nature trail photo walk workshop will take us along a local nature trail. We will meet at Artzone and travel in our cars to the trailhead. Weather may dictate which local trail we walk but plan accordingly and wear shoes that won't be destroyed if they get muddy. The goal of this workshop is to improve our photo awareness and learning how to "see with our cameras". Nature, environmental portraits, close-ups/macro, and still life photo opportunities will be available. This is a "hands on" approach to learning photography skills and there will be instruction and conversation throughout the workshop (shutter speed usage, aperture, etc.).

The photographer's goal is to capture the information that allows us to create an image that we see in our "mind's eye"...not necessarily what we see with our eyes.

Participants should wear comfortable shoes and clothing that is appropriate for the weather. Bring your camera bag, small snacks if desired, and water. This workshop will be slightly more challenging than the urban workshop in that we will be away from available services and shops so we must bring everything with us. It isn't a difficult walk and we will try to stay away from poison ivy and such. Keep in mind that you will be carrying your equipment for several hours so plan accordingly. If the weather is anything short of a monsoon the workshop will take place....rain or shine (that's part of the fun!).
